# Daltons Sunflowers $x^{2}$ in kindergartens 

Here's a great way for children to record the weather and learn about how it affects their sunflower throughout the project.

## What you need:

Sunflower template (pg2)
Weather icons template (pg3)
Weather chart (pg4)
Construction paper

Glue
1 Scissors
. Laminate
Cotton balls (optional)
-1. Velcro / blu-tack

## Step one

Print the sunflower and weather icons templates. Cut the pieces out and glue the sunflower head, stem and leaves onto a large sheet of construction paper. Do not glue the weather icons down.

## Step two

For durability laminate the weather icons and the piece of construction paper with the sunflower on it. For texture you can glue cotton balls onto the cloud icons.


## Step three

Put velcro or blu-tack on the center of the sunflower and on the back of the weather icons.

## Step four

Each day have the children look outside, determine the weather and then put the appropriate weather icon in the middle of the sunflower.

## Step five



Print the provided weather chart. Have the children record the weather each day. At the end of the sunflower project count up the days and see if you have had more sunny, sunny/cloudy, cloudy, windy, rainy or stormy days.
